

EYFS Assessment

- The 7 areas of learning and development guide the staff to plan for individual needs of your child as they learn new skills and knowledge
- Your child's learning and progress will be shared with you each term in parent's meetings.
- At the end of Reception all children should achieve 'A Good Level of Development' in all areas of the curriculum which is the 'expected' level at the end of EYFS.

Reading in Reception

•It is important that you read or share a book with your child everyday for at least 10 mins

•This can be reading on 'Bug club' website, library book, books at home, levelled reading book, magazine, comic, leaflets.

Reading Records

Reading records need to be signed everyday

Rewards for Reading

We encourage parents to read with their children once every evening or at least 4 times a week.

If your child reads with you <u>4 times a week</u> and this is recorded in their reading record book they will receive a sticker/stamp for that week on the class reading record chart (usually displayed in your classroom window).

If your child receives a stamp or sticker every week, they will receive prize at the end of the term.





PHONICS

We use RWI and Letters and Sounds Phonics schemes. The children learn 44 sounds and rhymes with pictures. When they have learnt a group of sounds they begin to segment and blend small words e.g m-a-t mat



LEARNING RED & HIGH FREQUENCY WORDS




The red words and phonic sounds will be sent home as children learn them.

<u>Family Reading Time</u>

- Every Friday from 8:45-9:00am starting after half term
- •Parents will be invited to come into school and read with their child and their friends each week.
- Teachers and Nursery Nurses will model strategies to support your child with reading.





Home learning tasks

- Mini activities to do at home with your child based on what they have been learning in class or based on the current topic every 2 weeks e.g bringing in a family photo.
- Phonic sounds sent home to learn every week.
- Once every term there will be a creative project.





Remember to support your child with home learning but it MUST be their work.

Naming your child's belongings

Uniform- purple school sweatshirt, white polo-shirt, grey jogging trousers or grey trousers, black shoes- see school office if you need to order items.

P.E Kit- black shorts/leggings, black plimsolls (velcro)& purple t-shirt (name all items)

Jewellery- studs only apart from PE daysno earrings at all **Behaviour**- happy, worried, sad faces (time out) Golden face!!!!



Star award- presented every week to a child for behaviour, outstanding work or significant contribution to class life

Attendance & Punctuality

97% attendance is our whole school target!!

- <u>8:45am</u> drop off and collect at <u>3:15pm</u>
- It is very important your child attends school every day as they
 miss out on learning! Persistent absence is 90% and below.

Sickness

- If your child is sick please phone the school office to let them know.
- If your child has sickness and diarrhoea and is feeling better after a day please send them into school. If it persists bring them back after 48hrs.
- NO HOLIDAY LEAVE- Each child & parent will be charged £120 per parent per child. if taken out of school and you may risk losing their place in school.
